Our impact in 2021-22

Since inception, Antarang has encouraged over 37 lakh young adults to aspire for careers of their choice. We have worked with the education departments of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation, Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, Thane Municipal Corporation, Pune Municipal Corporation, Pimpri Chinchwad Municipal Corporation, the District Education Office, Udaipur and the Department of Education, Government of Goa, to deliver effective career guidance at scale. **In 2021-22 we have impacted over 35000 students.**

As an organisation, Antarang Foundation has been a champion of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Our program alumni make up one-third of our organization's staff, and our average age is 26 years. Youth voice has always been central to our way of working. This year, nine alumni interns were promoted to staff positions. We also have a Youth Advisory Board, which ensures growth and ensures that the youth voice is ingrained in our culture.

At Antarang, we want to work with young adults, not just for them.

This year, we also worked to make a difference through a variety of youth-led initiatives.

2021-22 saw our alumni taking the lead on several fronts.

From strategy to recruitment to COVID response to program implementation, youth voice was loud and clear. Read on for some key highlights.



Empowering adolescent girls to become self-reliant and agents of change

Antarang + the EMpower* Adolescent Girls' Learning Community focused on empowering young women by addressing various issues like eve teasing, improper sanitation and gender bias faced by adolescent girls.

- 77 individuals participated in NukkadNukkad Natak and Kishori Cricket Tournament.
- 55 individuals participated in the self-defence workshop for women's safety.
- 34 individuals participated in advocacy with local government for sanitation.

*EMpower's Adolescent Girls Learning Communities are vibrant groups, comprised of local grantee partner organizations, mentors and girls, which nurture and empower girls as leaders.

Student Support Ambassadors

Antarang built a cadre of Student Support Ambassadors (SSA) to support students of 9th and 10th grade who could not attend virtual CareerAware sessions.

They helped the students with:

- Providing relevant career information
- Registering with Nantar Kay (24x7 WhatsApp chatbot)
- Trying out the Interest Aptitude and Reality tests
- Attending online sessions.

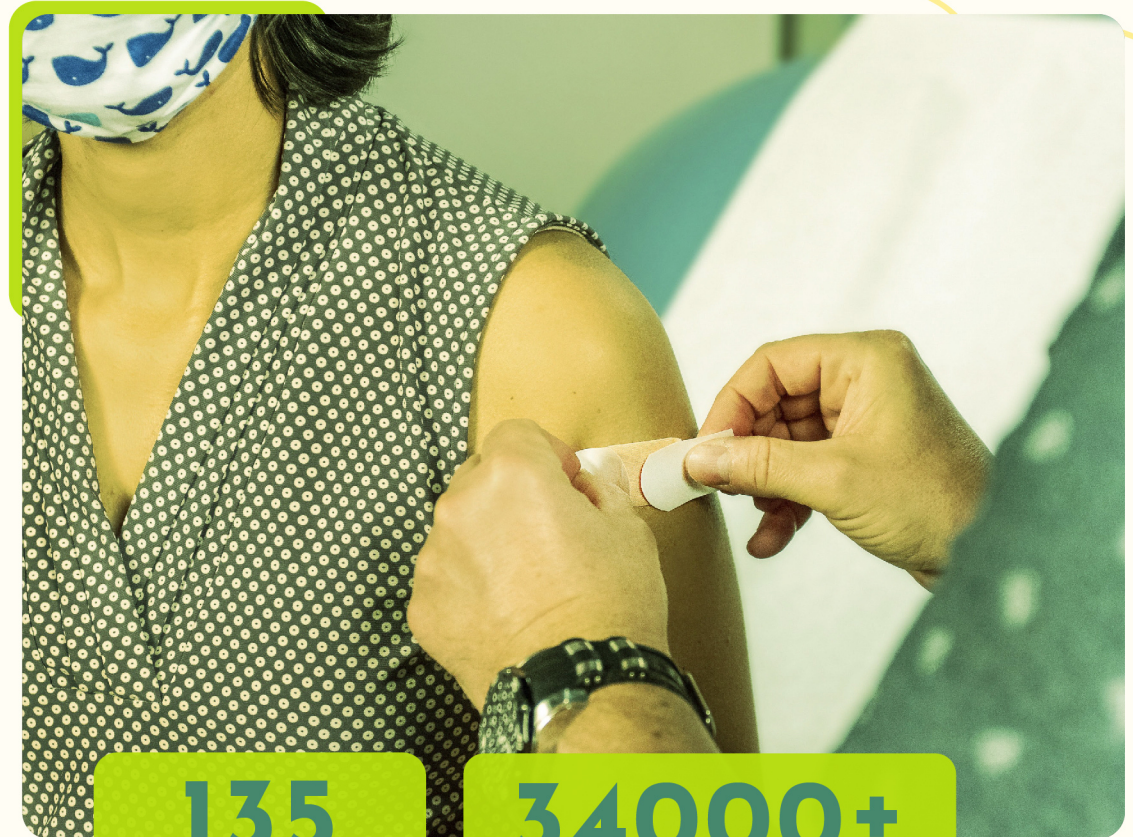
They documented student's feedback on the program and the chatbot.



The Covid-19 saviours, our Vaccination Awareness Ambassadors

Antarang Foundation built a cadre of young Vaccination Awareness Ambassadors and promoters between the age of 16-25 years to help build awareness and resilience against Covid-19 in the vulnerable communities of Mumbai and ensure they have access to vaccines and other precautionary measures.

- Held vaccination drives for 1645 youth and their family members.
- Made 3000 phone calls to collect data, book slots and explain covid protection norms.
- Reached 30,000 people through the online Vaccination Awareness campaign.

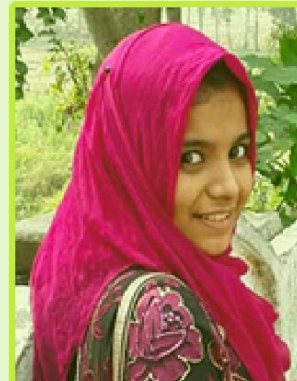

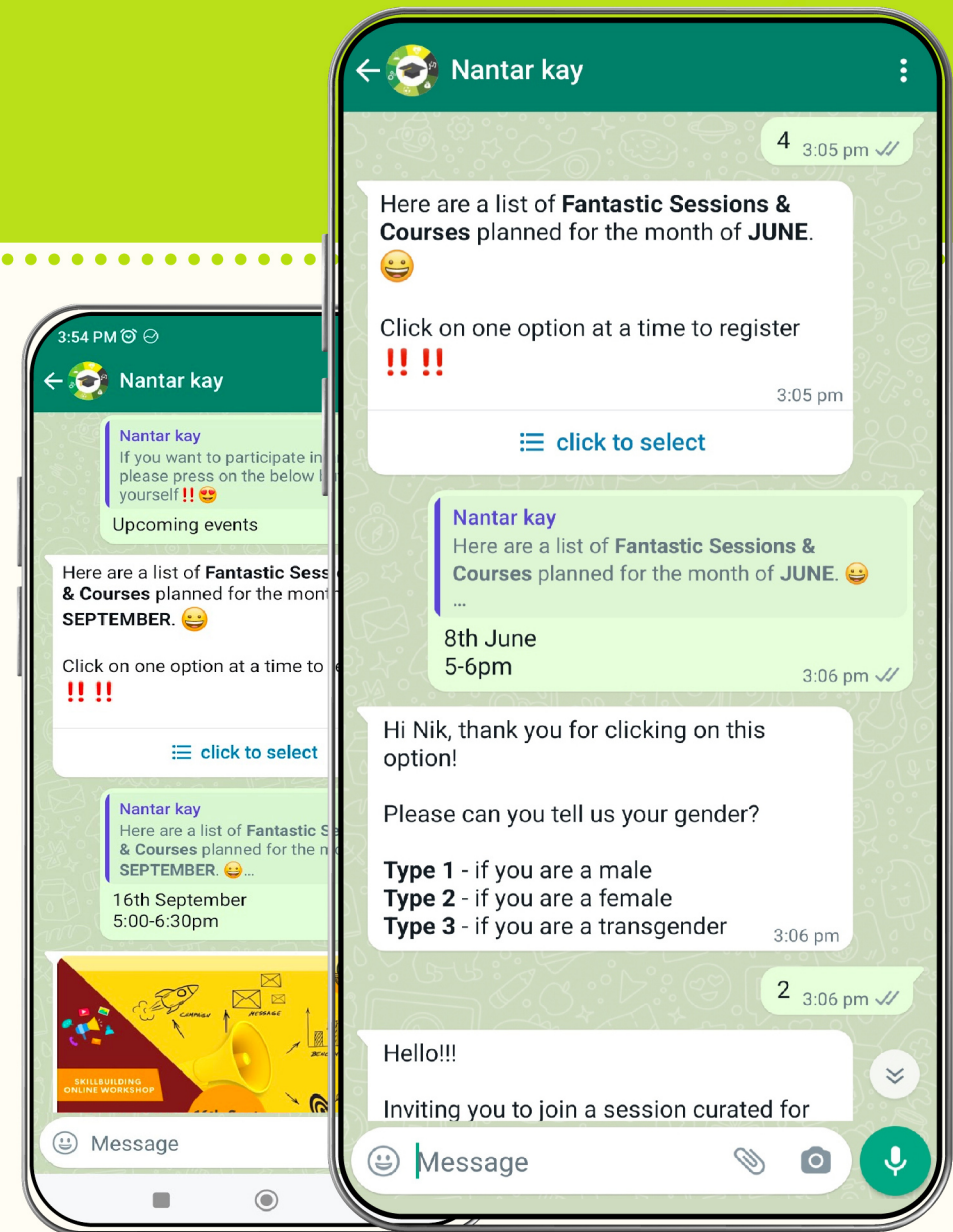

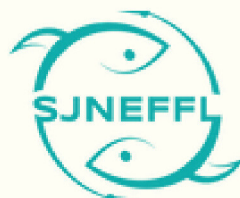


Partnering with the Government

By 2030, Antarang Foundation aspires to enable 2.5 million urban youth to embark and thrive on a career trajectory of their choice. By leveraging government partnerships, we implemented career guidance as part of the high school education with Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM), Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC), Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC), Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC), Pimpri Chinchwad Municipal Corporation (PCMC), Udaipur District Authority, and the state government of Goa. In 2021-22, we conducted virtual and in-person sessions to make students aware of their interests and aptitude, exposed them to a multitude of careers, and helped them create career plans post class 10. We also conducted a Transition Tracking survey to track career pathways and choices of students post grade 10 along with transition support.

In September 2021, Antarang Foundation was approached by The Education Alliance, who run the Program Management Unit for the Department of Education, Government of Tamil Nadu. Along with TEA, senior program and curriculum experts from Antarang developed an integrated Career Guidance and Career Readiness framework for grades 9-12. Our team worked closely with the Tamil Nadu SCERT (State Council for Educational Research and Training), teachers, headmasters of secondary and senior secondary schools, and other NGO partners to create a comprehensive framework for career guidance of youth in the state. This framework was then built into a full-fledged curriculum, and is now being implemented across the entire state of Tamil Nadu for students of grades 9-12.

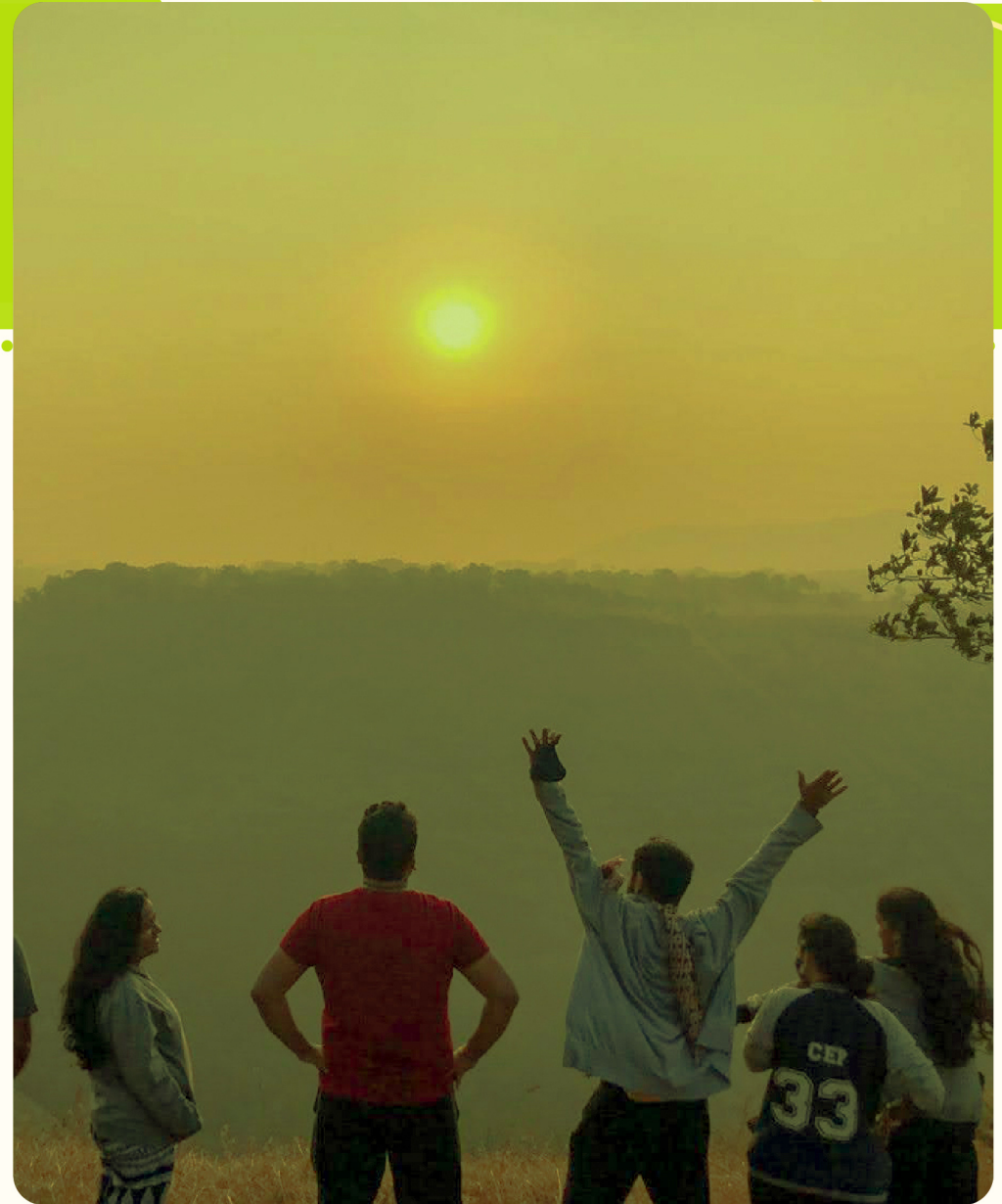
